

Sermon Title: Discernment: Wise Counsel and Discernment

Scripture: Proverbs 12:15

The way of fools seems right to them, but the wise listen to advice.

(NIV)

Sermon Outline:

As Christians the two questions below should be part of our discernment process as we make extremely important decisions when it comes to discerning God's will for our lives.

- 1. What do you think Jesus is saying to you at this point in your life, in the context of the challenges and opportunities you are facing?
- 2. What indicators give you some measure of confidence that it is indeed Jesus speaking to you rather than someone or something else?

We tend to use the ways below to make decisions:

- 1. Always discerning before deciding.
- 2. Always deciding but never discerning.
- 3. Deciding from a place of discernment.

Discernment is good judgment, wisdom, and the ability to distinguish between the sound and unsound, the true and the false, the good and the bad – and also the better from the merely good. --James Manney

Discernment is the ability to make a distinction between the options we have before us. The Bible is clear on the benefit on seeking counsel and the consequences if we choose to reject it. Call of scripture is that we are to be a people who decide from a place of discernment.

To wisely discern God's will often require a community of wise people.

The three types of counsel below are ways we tend to receive counsel for decisions in our lives.

- **Inviting No Counsel**. Being inward focused. As Christians, God created us to be in community so that we can acknowledge our limits apart from community.
- **Inviting Bad Counsel**. Heading foolish advice. Failing to embrace our limits and looking to gain more and more. As Christians, we are to think thoughtfully about the life that God has given us.
- Inviting Wise Counsel. We are to surround ourselves with individuals who can help us be aware
 of our blind spots and see what we often have a hard time acknowledging and seeing for
 ourselves.

In Jesus Christ, God has invited you and I into a new family – the family of God. If we want to be a people who are looking to discern God's will for our lives, we need community to help us as we seek wise counsel.
