

Sermon Title: Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of Jesus Makes All Things New Speaker: Richard Villodas, Lead Pastor Scripture: Revelation 1:17-18, 21:5

¹⁷ When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. Then he placed his right hand on me and said: "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. ¹⁸ I am the Living One; I was dead, and now look, I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades.

Sermon Outline:

We all long for new things and in the process of doing so, we tend to do away with those things that we believe are older and no longer useful. We also long for broken things to be made new. Newness is a possibility in Jesus Christ.

Easter Sunday is the greatest Sunday in human history. Jesus Christ does not stay dead and because he is risen from the dead, we can also be made alive again.

We read the book of Revelation to see the world from Jesus's perspective. The scripture of this book is giving us human history from God's perspective.

Behold, I am making all things new.

The Resurrection of Christ declares that Jesus is alive and moving on our behalf. The good news of Easter is that God doesn't give up on things that seem to be dead. God works with what God has, which is good news for every one of us.

God's solution for a creation marred by sin and death is not to abandon it, evacuate it, condemn it, or destroy it, **but to remake it – to make it new again!** This is what was inaugurated on Easter! -- Brian Zhand

Jesus Christ is the same Jesus Christ that died and rose from the dead. God knows how to take things that have no life and are out of order, and make them new.

I am making all things new.

I am = Jesus Christ is letting us know that he is the source of life and the newness that we are looking for. making = this is the God who is always active and working in our lives at this very moment. all things = nothing in the world is out of the reach of Jesus Christ's grace and love, God is making ALL things new.

new = Jesus Christ is letting us know that in him we are all made new.

Sin and death do not have the final word. Jesus has the final word over our lives, our world, and the church.

On Easter Sunday we declare a God who can bring life out of death.
