WORDS FROM OUR LEAD PASTOR



Dear New Lifers,

Every June we take the time to pause, look around, and celebrate all that God is doing in the life of our community. And not just that. We seek to discern how the Spirit might be leading us into the next season of our life together.

The past year has been one of fruitfulness and new community. While the global pandemic is in our rearview mirror, we are still feeling the impact of the universal disruption we all experienced. Even as we do, we have seen the beautiful work of Jesus in our midst.

Our Board of Elders continues to steward and oversee the mission of New Life with care, wisdom, and prudence. I want to give a special mention to Steven McIntosh, our Board Chair. Steven's tireless commitment to our local church has positioned us to be in a place of great health in recent years.

Our Staff has also worked with great passion and care, serving our congregation in so many ways around the building of community, spiritual formation, and being missionally engaged in our city.

Our Long Island congregation, New Life East celebrated its 1-year anniversary in November 2022. Pastor Redd and Pastor Dre have led this community in wonderful ways, as they prepare for the long-planned transition of leadership to Pastor Dre, who will become the Congregational Pastor this September. Our Community Life team has worked hard to create multiple spaces for connection and resources to help our community be formed in the way of Jesus. Over 65% of our church is in a small group community. In a world that's increasingly lonely, this is a wonderful point of celebration!

We are continuing to see a resurgence of activity among our NextGen community. When I think about New Life Fellowship five, ten, twenty, or fifty years from now, I firmly believe that the work we do today will determine the quality of our witness to Jesus tomorrow. Our children and students are in good hands with the team we've assembled—and we have a great opportunity before us to deepen our commitment to them.

Our School of Formation continues to flourish as well. In Cohort 1, we trained 30 leaders. In Cohort 2, we doubled that amount. I'm hoping to gather a strong number of New Lifers for Cohort 3 which starts in September 2024. Through this school, we aim to form followers of Jesus who are profoundly shaped by the 5 values that have anchored New Life over the years.

When I ponder the next year of New Life, there are a few areas of focus I want to bring before you.

 First, I would love our NextGen ministry to receive greater support and investment. This means that we will need more volunteers and leaders to engage the work

of the Lord in this area. I trust that the Spirit will lead us to become more connected to the next generation.

- Another area of focus is ensuring a smooth transition at New Life East from Pastor Redd to Pastor Dre, which includes the pursuit of a new place of worship, as we have outgrown our current facility. Please pray with us as we discern the next steps here.
- And, lastly, 2023 is a year of anniversaries. This year we celebrate our 20th anniversary since purchasing The Elks Lodge in Elmhurst. It is also the 100th anniversary of the building's completion. God has graciously provided this house of worship for us, and we have worked diligently to see every space maximize its potential. In the coming months, you will be hearing more about the plans we have to continue this work. Additionally, this Fall is my 10th anniversary as lead pastor of New Life. I regard this anniversary as a church-wide event because we wouldn't be where we are as a congregation without everyone's support, prayers, and leadership. Many churches struggle to transition leadership from one pastor to the next, but our congregation has been a model of health in this area.

There is much to rejoice about, friends. Rosie and I are so grateful to be part of this local church family.

- New Paint, flooring, and light fixtures were installed in the second-floor nursery.
- New Paint and light fixtures were installed in the second-floor elephant room. (4 & 5-year-olds)

WORDS FROM OUR ELDER BOARD CHAIR



Dear Members of New Life Fellowship Church,

For the past few weeks, I've had a verse that my heart has been holding fast to: Rejoice in hope, be patient in affliction, persevere in prayer (Romans 12:12). While chapter 12 is full of the Apostle Paul's encouragement to the church about what our lives should look like as Christfollowers, this verse stands out because of how applicable it is to any part of our lives. When life is hard, when relationships aren't easy, when Church is messy, when family is difficult, and when we feel our brokenness, Jesus is still at work in you and through you. Rejoice, be patient, persevere.

I'm grateful that you're part of our NLF community and appreciate all the ways you join our mission to deeply transform lives through Jesus—whether you supported another New Lifer, contributed your time and/or resources to New Life Ministries, participated in a small group or workshop series, or prayed for our leadership. You are an integral part of the NLF family, and Jesus is working through you to transform our community to look more like Him.  I want to thank Pastor Rich, Pastor Jackie, the entire New Life Fellowship staff, deacons, and volunteers for all their hard work and ministry accomplishments over the past year. Thank you for the hope, patience, and perseverance you've exuded as you faithfully care for







We held our first-ever Missional Imagination Panel Discussions, which featured New Lifers on mission in the world and locally.



Making Disciples Of All Nations

more highlights

ADVENTures provided a series of opportunities for New Lifers to be on mission together during Advent: a Missions Market to support nonprofits serving underserved and vulnerable women around the world, a Christmas party for migrant families from a local shelter in collaboration with Expansion Church staffed by 43 New Lifers, and for our New Life CDC, 47 New Lifers served in the Food Pantry and 76 provided Christmas gifts for families receiving grocery deliveries.

- Altogether, we had 126 New Lifers serve in these opportunities.
- Many vendors expressed gratitude for high engagement in the Missions market, with several nearly selling out of their goods.
- Nearly \$10,000 was raised in support of the various services including rescuing victims of trafficking, providing hope, counseling, and economic empowerment, and providing homes for orphans.
- Over \$1,100 was raised for the New Life CDC's Women's Health Center through the selling of baked goods provided by New Lifers and art by New Lifer Jefte Valle.
