

Sermon Title: Lexicon of Faith: A Fresh Look at Ancient Words – Confession Speaker: Andre Grey - New Life East Pastor Scripture: Psalm 32:1-7

¹ Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.
² Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against them and in whose spirit is no deceit.

³ When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long.
⁴ For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer.^[b]

⁵ Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity.
I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD."
And you forgave the guilt of my sin.

Sermon Summary:

This weekend, we continue our summer sermon series titled, Lexicon of Faith. This series explores 8 popular Bible words that many people have misunderstood or misused. This Sunday, New Life East Pastor Andre Grey will lead us in a message focusing on the word, **Confession**. Confession is the spiritual practice that allows us to enter into the grace and mercy of God in such a way that we experience forgiveness and healing for the sins and sorrows of the past.

Sermon Questions:

- 1. Slowly read Psalm 32:1-7. What stands out to you?
- 2. What keeps you from confession? Ex. Shame, guilt, pride, fear, distrust, hiding

- 3. How does David's story speak to you? He is described as "a man after God's own heart," but ended up committing adultery and murder. In hiding from the pain he caused great agony for himself and others.
- 4. Pastor Andre said, "Confession is the liberating practice of acknowledging our sin that moves us away from fear, shame and pride towards God's forgiving love for us." What is God inviting you to confess today?
- 5. Consider the three steps Pastor Andre gave to live out the practice of confession: 1) Grieve how your failures have harmed others, God and yourself 2) Acknowledge/Confess your sin 3) Receive God's love and forgiveness
