Sermon Title: A Deeper Righteousness

Scriptures: Matthew 6:9-11

9 “This, then, is how you should pray:

“Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
10 your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
11 Give us today our daily bread.

Sermon Summary:

This Sunday, Pastor Rich will continue our series through The Narrow Path. We will explore the first three requests Jesus instructs us to pray for that make a significant difference in the ways we are formed by the world around us.

Sermon Questions:

1. What were you taught about prayer growing up (in religious or non-religious settings)?
2. What does prayer look like in your life now? (Feel free to share challenges or places of growth)
3. The first request of the Lord’s Prayer is that God’s name would be hallowed or “holy, set apart, and treasured.” In what ways have you seen God’s name being used in ways that are inconsistent with God’s character?
4. How would you describe the Kingdom of God? What do you think Jesus means when he says, “your Kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven (v. 10)? What does it look like when God’s kingdom comes? Note: Pastor Rich said, “The kingdom is what the world looks like when God is ordering the world.”
5. Pastor Rich shared that praying for daily bread leads to two things: radical dependence on God and radical contentment in us. How are you challenged to have radical dependence and contentment? (How do you relate to having a Costco relationship with God and desire blessings in bulk?)
